Dear Parents,

The early school years of a child's life are key in raising interested and enthusiastic readers. With the modern distractions of TV, iPads, videogames, computers, and more, it is more important than ever to get your children off on the right foot towards a love of reading.

Research tells us that if a student is not reading at grade level by the end of third grade the chances are quite good that they will never catch up nor enjoy reading as an adult. Becoming a competent reader takes practice and hours and hours of reading independently.

So how does a diligent parent infuse this love of reading and motivate their sons and daughters to read? Below are some strategies for you to consider. I encourage you to keep this list of ideas as your child moves through elementary school.

- Visit your local library often. Get your children their own library cards. Attend story hour or other free events at the library. (We always post Marin County library announcements at the end of this newsletter).
- Check out the local bookstore. A book or gift certificate always makes a terrific gift or a special surprise.
- Let your child see you reading, whether it is the newspaper, a magazine, or simply a good book.
- Encourage older children to read to their younger siblings or have the whole family set aside some time to read together! (Thursday No Homework Nights are perfect for this!)
- Show your child how people use reading all the time. Read aloud street and store signs, maps, billboards, menus, and labels on packages.
- Create a library for your child of new or used books. Look for books at yard sales, secondhand bookstores, and library book sales.
- Set up an area in your home where a variety of reading materials are within easy reach. Encourage writing by including paper, crayons, pens and pencils. (A good reader often goes hand in hand with a good writer.)
- Subscribe to a children's magazine. Take time to read it with your child.
- Carry books to read to your child wherever you go - at the doctor's office, in line at the store, or on a long car ride. (You can also listen to stories on tape.)
- Encourage a love of words by playing rhyming and word games, singing silly songs, or writing poems and stories together.
- Talk about daily activities or tell stories about your family or culture to help children develop their language skills.
- Visit the Between the Lions web site (pbskids.org/lions) for more information on children and reading.

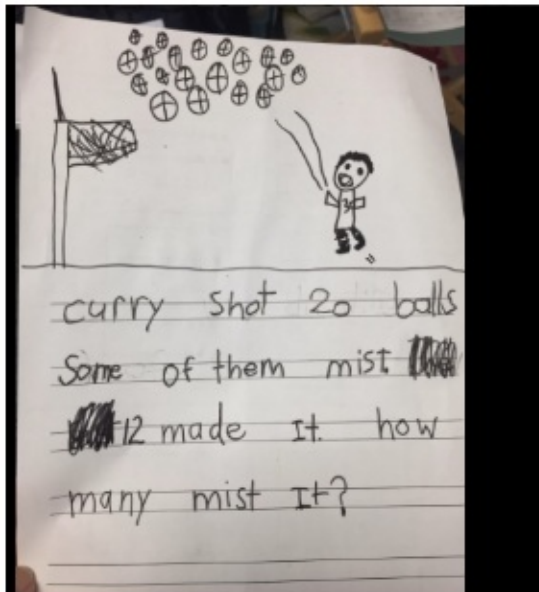
Bacich Math Team

Bacich utilizes the Eureka Math program, as well as other support materials to engage students in meaningful activities to foster understanding of foundational math concepts through hands-on, collaborative, integrated instruction.

The Bacich Math Matters website contains specific information and support tools for curriculum content at each grade level. This is a rich resource with useful links and materials for both parents and students to support efforts at home. All students are encouraged to reinforce their math skills at home by utilizing websites Dreambox and Zearn, which can be accessed from home.
