In this one-hour online presentation, Julie King shares useful guidance and tools for parents who are doing their best to cope with the effects of the pandemic on home life. Her presentation is interactive, and includes topics such as:

- * children under stress: understanding typical behavior, and how to support children with shelter-in-place
- * how to engage children's cooperation
- * how to reduce the fighting
- * strategies for dealing with all the screen time!

Since 1995, **Julie King** has been educating and supporting parents and professionals who live or work with children ages two to teens. She consults by phone and video chat with parents, leads

"How To Talk" workshops and support groups online and in person, and speaks publicly to schools, parent groups and businesses throughout the Bay Area as well as nationally and internationally. Together with Joanna Faber, she is co-author of the book *How To Talk So LITTLE Kids Will Listen: A Survival Guide to Life with Children Ages 2-7*, which has been ranked a #1 best seller on Amazon, and has been translated into 22 languages. She and Joanna collaborated on the companion app, *Pocket Parent*. Julie has a J.D. from Yale Law School and a B.A. from Princeton University.
