New Programs: Transitional Kindergarten & School Lunch



The KSD is reinstating Transitional Kindergarten (TK) for children turning five (5) between September 2 and February 2, and we are thrilled to serve our preschool age youngsters on the Bacich campus. Measure D: Citizens Oversight Committee 2022 Report

Kentfield School District's Measure D General Obligation Bonds were authorized in the general election of November 2014. Seventy percent of voters in our school district approved the issuance and sale of bonds with a principal amount not to exceed \$30,000,000.

Upon passage of Measure D, the Board engaged the services of CSDA Design Group to lead the community through master facilities planning and subsequently hired QKA Architects, Counterpoint Construction Services for construction management services, and Lathrop Construction as its builders. An inclusive, nine-month-long design process engaged staff and community in planning additions and improvements.

Modernization, safety upgrades, and new administrative offices were completed at both campuses, as well as a new music classroom at Kent and a new building at Bacich housing six classrooms, student breakout rooms, storage, and restrooms. This summer the District has continued work with QKA Architects and Lathrop Construction to support both sites with new heating ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) units. Due to the manufacturing backlog of the HVAC units, this final project is anticipated to be complete by December 2022.

In accordance with the requirements of Proposition 39, the District established a Citizens Oversight Committee (COC)

to review and report on the expenditure of bond revenues. Members of the committee represent the constituencies prescribed by Proposition 39. The Citizens Oversight Committee reviewed the School Board-approved annual financial and performance audits (April 2022) of the Measure D Building Fund and confirmed that bond funds are being expended for the purposes described in the ballot measure. The final closing report on Measure D Bond funds shall happen by June 2023.
