Superintendent's Update



I was asked at a presentation last evening to name the biggest challenge facing the district next year. It was not hard to identify the construction at Bacich as the winner of that distinction.

When school lets out on June 15, 2018 fences will go up, encircling the round building and half of the main parking lot. Demolition will begin on the round

building and by the start of school, 2019, a new classroom building and administrative complex is scheduled to be open for business in its place.

We can't wish away the challenges that a large construction project presents on an active and full school campus. What we can do, and have been doing, is anticipate and prepare as best we can for those challenges.

Students will be excited and fascinated by the sights and sounds of a building coming down and another one going up. They will take their cues from us, the adults, about how to react to changes in routines brought about by the dust, noise and blocked access points. They will learn from our flexibility, resilience and adaptability, and in the end, when we move into our fabulous new spaces, we'll forget what the fuss was all about.

Bacich Elementary School



Dear Bacich Families,

Zero Waste Marin, Marin Sanitary Service, and Bacich are working together to reduce waste on our school campus. Our students are guided and supported each day by our school Green Team to help sort our recycling and composting.

We would like to ask you to do the same! Around the Bacich campus, you have probably noticed some new recycling and composting receptacles. The landfill receptacles (gray trash cans) are located near a recycling and composting receptacle for everyone's convenience.

Parent and community support is critical to the success of our Zero Waste Program. We encourage you to use our waste stations and properly sort your waste even during afterschool hours and weekends. Remember, that dog poop bags and coffee cups are landfill, pizza boxes and food-soiled paper are compostable, and drink bottles and cans are recyclable. You might even consider packing it in and packing it out!

Did you know that Marin County citizens produced an average of 4.6 pounds per person per day of garbage in 2016, which was dumped into landfill? With roughly 260,651 residents, that is a lot of waste! Zero Marin Waste is working with Kentfield/Greenbrae residents, businesses, and the schools to decrease this amount of trash.

The diagram below shows the pictures found on our bin systems. (You also might notice that we do not collect paper in the outdoor waste stations. Look for the big blue bins to toss out paper.)

Bacich aims to reduce waste on campus.

Please join us by sorting your waste into our 3-bin system!

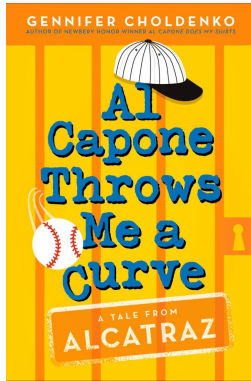

Bacich Certificated Staff Golden Bell Award Recipient

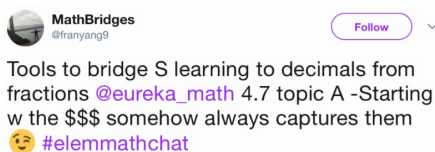
